Collaboration Canvas (hand-out)

The canvas can help you brainstorm, structure and talk about your collaboration project. Below you can find questions to guide you. You don't need to answer all the questions; they are intended as impulses for thinking and exchange. Use what is helpful for you and feel free to disregard the rest. Happy collaborating!

Partner Input (What do you bring to this collaboration?)

- What motivates each partner to engage in the collaboration?
 How does it align with each of your organisation's strategies?
- What are the needs, challenges and/or weaknesses of each organisation that are addressed through this collaboration project?
- What would partners like to learn from each other or together?
- What will each partner contribute to the collaboration? Are these contributions financial, technical, knowledge-based, human resources etc.?
- How can these resources support your collaboration and benefit both organisations and communities?
- Who in your teams, organisations, networks do you plan to involve? What do they offer? How can they benefit from this project?
- Who else do you want to work with? Which organisations from your cities? Which artists? How do you involve them? What is in it for them?

Partner Outcome (What do you get from this collaboration?)

• What are the expected increased capacities, growth, development and networks for each organisation?

- What are the expected increased skills, learnings, experience and networks for each partner?
- What are the specific advantages of this collaboration, both for the project itself, the partners involved, and the broader community or intended audience?
- What will you do to make sure you can continue your collaboration beyond the original project duration?
- What are possible routes for successful closing, scaling or institutionalising the partnership?

Project Impacts

- What are the expected outputs (tangible/quantitative) of the collaboration project?
- What are the expected outcomes (intangible/qualitative)?
- How do you know it worked? What are the indicators for success?
- How can the project become sustainable? By scaling up?
 Scaling deep? Multiplication?

Objectives

Based on your inputs, and expected outcomes and impacts: what do you want to achieve with the collaboration?

- What is the overall goal of the project
- What is the purpose of this collaboration?
- When is your collaboration successful?

Partner Agreements (How will you work together?)

 Which ethics, values and principles do partners have in common?

- How do you want to work? What mindset or (work) attitude do you strive for?
- Who is involved in the collaboration and what will they do?
- Which partner will be in charge of implementing which activity?
- Will there be joint responsibilities? Are boundaries between responsibilities clear?
- How does the distribution of responsibilities relate to each partners' capacities?
- Do you have support from 'senior management'?
- How will collaboration or project advancement and performance be reviewed? And how often?
- What procedures are in place in case your time frame needs to be adjusted?
- Have you co-created ground rules to support good communications between partners?
- Are there imbalances in the partnership (e.g. size or status of organisation) that might affect your collaboration?
- Which issues will be brought up for collective decision-making?
 How will you decide?
- Do you have similar views about project management? What are the minimum quality standards?
- What are the rules for using funds? Who can spend what?
- Do you have all the resources (incl. skills and knowledge), or do you need to find external support?
- Who is responsible for financial administration? Who will request grants payment?
- Did you do a risk analysis of your partnership? E.g. personal changes, organisational capacities (financial and other)
- What arrangements do you have in place in case of misunderstandings or conflicts?
- What is the best way to allow for changes in internal or external circumstances?

• What if a partner wants/needs to quit the partnership? Did you think of an exit strategy?

Project Management

- What is your idea about? How will it work?
- When is your collaboration project a success?
- How did you come to this proposal?
- How is it innovative? Why is it new for you?
- Why is it relevant for others working in this field? How can they benefit?
- How will your project change the future?
- Who are the direct target groups of your project and how will they benefit from the project? Who are the indirect beneficiaries and how will they benefit from the project?
- Who is your target audience?
- What kind of activities are you planning for your project?
- What about distribution/dissemination/communications?
- What are the main costs of the project?
- What are the main sources of income? Incl. own contributions?
- What does the budget look like?
- What happens if you cannot secure all the necessary resources?
- What potential risks or challenges do you foresee in your project? How do your entities as partners plan to reduce or manage those risks?
- How you will measure the success or evaluate the project.
